The Boys and Girls Club has offered leadership and support to thousands of youth ages 7 - 17. Through one-to-one interaction with trained adult staff, Club members learn to make positive decisions about their lives. They do better in school, stay away from drugs and gangs and begin to set personal goals for themselves, which ultimately helps them be responsible citizens of our community. The Boys and Girls Club offers sports activities, computer training, tutoring, leadership clubs, photography, camp, Lifeline mentoring program. Some additional programs include:

Job Ready: Is a comprehensive program that teaches young people ages 14-18 effective job-hunting techniques and helps them develop the skills necessary to be successful once on the job.

Power Hour: Is a comprehensive homework help and tutoring program. Power Hour is designed to raise the academic proficiency of Club members.

21st Century: Is federally funded by the State and provides afterschool tutoring with Certified Teachers. Also, provides support and assistance to club members and parents to enhance educational skill level.

Tutoring: After-school tutoring available to all club members ages 7-17.

LEAP Afterschool Programs (LEAPs) : is to provide Tennessee students with academic enrichment

opportunities that reinforce and complement the regular academic program. The program is designed to reinforce and complement the regular academic program of participating students. All activities are educationally based. Such programs include: Services to students on an average of 15 hrs. per week; Reading skills development and enhancement; Math or science skills development and enhancement; Computer literacy and skills development; Academic mentoring or tutorial assistance; and Sports or leisure opportunities.

Ultimate Journey: This internationally recognized, award-winning program leads Club members ages 7-12 on a fun-filled journey into the amazing world of plants and animals. The Ultimate Journey motivates young people to develop an understanding of and sensitivity to the environment, helping them build the knowledge and motivation to protect our natural resources.

CareerLaunch: is a career exploration and mentoring program for teens ages 14-18. This program includes the CareerLaunch Web site that allows teens to take an interest survey, explore careers, identify training or college requirements, seek out financial aid and play skills-building games. There's also an easy-to-use Career Exploration Quick Reference Guide with a broad range of career planning and job skills activities that Club staff or volunteers can use with teens. The CareerLaunch Portfolio contains a Teen Tips booklet with helpful interviewing and on-the-spot job tips. This program is made possible through a partnership between Boys & Girls Clubs of America and the Gap Foundation.

Vocational Development: These programs are designed to expose club members to varied career and education opportunities. Members learn to write resumes, identify job opportunities, prepare for interviews and develop good work habits. Career Club, Job Referrals, Community Service Projects, Leadership Development, Employment Skills, Work Experience, Job Shadowing

Computer Training/Labs: The computer training programs give all of our members access to computers and a knowledge of computer technology.

The Chef's Club: is a cooking program which will teach youth members the basics in food preparation. This includes basic food safety tips, basic cooking terms, kitchen safety and the proper way to follow a recipe.

Bridge Builders seeks to develop a group of future leaders who will lay aside individual, social, economic and cultural differences to work for the benefit of all. Participants build the skills necessary to improve their self-confidence, strengthen their relationships, succeed in school and take action to build a healthy community - all while concentrating on three focus points.

PeaceJam an international education program focused on the lives and work of 12 Nobel Peace Laureates.

BRIDGES sponsors the program's Mid-South gatherings in partnership with Rhodes College, providing youth from Tennessee, Mississippi, Arkansas, Louisiana and Florida with invaluable insights on making peace in the world.

BRIDGES GED/Life Skills program Provides experiential learning for 17-21 year-olds who have faced challenges in their high school careers with intensive GED training, life skills courses, career development and teen parenting workshops. Twelve-week GED and pre-GED courses are offered at a cost of \$50 per student. The fee is refundable upon successful completion of either course. Life skills courses focus on self-esteem, conflict resolution, decision making and goal-setting. Career development training centers on resume writing, interviewing skills and office decorum. Students are recruited through word-of-mouth and by referrals from our community partners, including the Memphis City School system. The program currently serves 30 to 40 students per 12-week period.

Students are required to take an entrance exam and must be able to attend classes Monday through Thursday from 2 to 5 p.m.

BRIDGES' Future Builders program Provides hands-on, experiential education for a diverse group of middle school students to become leaders in building a better future for themselves and their community.

Future Builders - Summer The summer program consists of three 2-week adventure, leadership camps for rising sixth to ninth graders. Youth may participate in more than one session of camp, but the general framework of the experience will be the same.

Future Builders School year The school year program consists of monthly outdoor adventure and service-learning excursions for middle school students. The length of the experience will vary from one-day to two-days, depending on the excursion. A schedule of the outings will be set before the beginning of each school year.

Future Builders - Fall/Winter/Spring Break The school break program is scheduled during Memphis City Schools' fall/winter/spring breaks (often the same as Shelby County Schools' breaks) and consists of multiple days (depending on the break) of adventure, leadership and service-learning opportunities for middle school students.

Centenary United Methodist Church provides services that exist to combat community deterioration, provide relief to the poor, assist in residential rehabilitation, and promote commercial revitalization in the inner-city area of South Memphis. Its primary purpose is to improve the social environment and economic condition of the residents of this community. This Center hosts a number of community programs focused on recreation and also on education, health development and life skills counseling. Education programs include tutoring

services, a homework center, a computer technology program and computer repair classes. The church also operates a youth entrepreneurship class and offers life skills counseling. All of the programs are supported with church funds and volunteer staff from both the church and the community. The three main programs include:

1. The Family Life Center Gymnasium - In 1996, the congregation completed its Family Life Center Gymnasium, which has been a beacon for over 2,000 youth who reside in this low-income, high-poverty level community.
2. Families First Partnership - an official CompTIA A+ computer training site for persons making the transition from welfare to work. Individuals receive career assessment, soft computer skill training, training in computer repair leading to A+ certification, job readiness training and job placement. The Families First Partnership also works with the YWCA to offer these same services to women seeking employment in non-traditional areas and youth seeking training in computer repair.
3. Community Pizza Factory. - provides entrepreneurial skills for youth and delivers pizza to homes in the areas largely not served by pizza delivery services. At-risk youth are trained by volunteers in food service, food delivery methods, and business skills and are also able to interact with positive role models. All youth participants have been promoted in school and are acquiring values that promote self-discipline. After attending a total of 20 hours of training in business development, youth are involved in all aspects of business operations, including personnel and payroll administration, ordering supplies, taking orders, food preparation, delivery services, inventory control and bookkeeping procedures. This project utilizes the resources of the community, its human potential and its physical assets, to establish a viable community business enterprise. The Pizza Factory is currently not running.
