Successful entry into and participation in this program can serve as a conduit into the Alpha Omega Veterans Services continuum of housing services. .

Defense Depot

The "Drop-In" service center provides services to other homeless veterans residing in other facilities (shelter, transitional housing) and those on the street. The Center provides services to homeless veterans for a minimum of 40 hours per week over a minimum of 5 days a week and on a as needed unscheduled basis.The Service Center is a comfortable, safe place where homeless veterans can go to receive services, socialize with peers, read the daily paper, shower, use the phone (local) and come in off the street during the hours when many shelters are closed.

As a community-based effort the permanent housing is located in a residential neighborhood where many services and amenities are located. Jefferson Street Aftercare transitional housing program serves as a conduit into permanent housing. While in residence clients focal points are increased awareness in community socialization, sustaining employment and increased residential stability. Services include needs assessment, case management, education and employment counseling. The goal of the service and program are to empower the individual to be self sustaining.
