Clients from the Memphis Jewish community benefit greatly from grants which help underwrite important agency services: The Elaine Ames Senior Outreach Fund provides funding which allows JFS staff to bring Jewish programming opportunities to older adults who are disconnected from the Jewish community, the Rose and Ben Margolin Family Assistance Fund provides financial help to meet special needs within the Jewish community, the Joseph Margolin Loan Fund was established at Jewish Family Service in 1995. Since its inception, a total of 53 loans have been granted to help individuals and families who needed a little extra help when other resources were exhausted, the Nate and Minnie Bernstein Scholarship Program provides need-based scholarships for Jewish boys and girls. The scholarships are awarded at the discretion of the JFS Board of Directors Scholarship Committee and the Lewis "Red" Kramer Jewish Loan Association is conducted in concert with The Memphis Jewish Federation.
